John shared with us that the Charles Koch Foundation is beginning to shift its research focus away from economic freedom issues/concerns and instead concentrate on ways to improve one's personal economic situation. Under that broad umbrella could be topics such as ways to improve economic literacy, economic security issues that impact the elderly and an expanding aging population and the economic costs/impact of the U.S. criminal justice system (at the federal, state and local levels) on individual citizens both inside and outside the system. The last item triggered our discussion about PAJ. John was especially interested in hearing about efforts to develop new metrics and benchmarks for evaluating and assessing the effectiveness (or ineffectiveness) of current criminal justice practices. What would really catch John's/Koch Foundation's interest would be new tools/metrics to measure the

economic costs/impact (both short and long-term) of the present criminal justice system on individual inmates and specific target populations within the system.

After you send John the PAJ packet, I would suggest that you follow-up with him to discuss PAJ in further detail and ask about meeting with him at his office in Arlington one of the next times you 're in DC . Thanks in advance for sending John the PAJ packet.
